

From Your Director of Missions —

April is a month when there is a sense of change in the air as the surrounding landscape beautifully blossoms forth, and the air grows refreshing. While spring brings changes around us, one emotion that seems to haunt us year-round is fear. There are uncertainties that surround us regarding the economy, one's health, war, and the spread of evil. Fear lingers in the air at times like a thick fog. Jesus spoke of coming days when the foundations will be shaken and "men's hearts fail them for fear" (Luke 21:26).

The Greek word for fear is φόβος (phobos), which means to "flee, withdrawal from, to avoid because of dread or fright, to remove oneself from because of feeling inadequate, withdraw from without sufficient resources." In Greek mythology, Phobos (fear) was the offspring of Aphrodite, the Greek goddess associated with love, and Ares, the Greek god of war. Phobos (fear) had a twin brother named Deimos (terror). Phobos (fear) and Deimos (terror) were known for accompanying their father, Ares, into battle. In time, Phobos (fear) became the personification of fear brought about by battle.

We experience many battles in our lives, and fear often makes us want to flee. Fear is the opposite of courage, the opposite of enduring with fortitude, the opposite of peace. Fear is a paralyzing emotion. Fear grips the soul when one feels they have lost control and that they are powerless to change the situation. Fear can be detrimental to our physical well-being. Fear results in the loss of one's creativity as one hunkers down instead of being innovative and productive.

When the very foundation of our lives is gripped by fear, what are we to do? For the Christian, the message that surrounds the Christ event is filled with "fear nots." When the angel told Mary she would give birth to the Christ Child, she was greeted with, "Fear not." When the angels appeared to the shepherds on the first Christmas night, their announcement began with, "Fear not." All through Jesus' ministry, He proclaimed, "Fear not." When the women appeared at the tomb of Jesus, they were greeted by an angelic message, "Fear not." The Gospel message is saturated with "fear nots."

What is the cure for fearing not? The resurrection of Christ gives us hope in the midst of fear. Trust in His glorious resurrection casts out fear. Christ's resurrection is the foundation of our faith, our hope, and our enduring strength as we face the fears of life.

One who has their feet firmly planted on the foundation of Christ's resurrection, what has he to fear or flee from? When we anchor our souls in His resurrection, there is nothing to dread in this world or the world to come, because we know nothing can separate us from the love of God which is Christ Jesus (Romans 9:35-39). His resurrection is the proof He was victorious over sin, death, and the devil. Resting our heads upon the resurrection pillow should free us from the apprehensions that often seek to overtake us. Knowing we have a Savior who supplies us with his resurrection power enables us to be more than adequate when confronted with life's fears.

Jesus whispers to each of us, "Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness" (Isiah 41:10). The remedy in the midst of life's fear is to trust in the One who arose from the dead on that first Easter morning, and rest our feet firmly on the foundation of Christ's resurrection.


