From Your Director of Missions - Dr. Dan Merritt

While the last month of the year arrives with the chilly shadow of winter lurking near, there can be heard the warmth of a song of celebration that a Savior has visited earth. The festive season of Christmas finds us focusing on the hope of the Holiday and allows us to temporarily escape the chaos and confusion that life can often bring. The Christmas story reminds us that, despite our circumstances, God remains on the throne and is sovereignly in control of His universe.

God had promised through the Old Testament prophets a Savior, but the pages of history began to pile higher and higher, but no Savior. Then one day, an angel appears to a young maiden named Mary, informing her that she would bear the Christ Child. While Mary was living in Nazareth, the prophet Micah foretold that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem. How is that going to happen, for Mary and her fiancé, Joseph, have no intention of going to Bethlehem? Joseph has an established carpentry business in Nazareth, and a trip to Bethlehem is not on his agenda.

Well, in the Providence of God, Caesar Augustus, oblivious to the visit of the angel to Mary, following the way of all rulers, decides to enact a census for the purpose of taxing the people of the Roman Empire. Mary and Joseph, both being from the House of David, are required to go to Bethlehem to register for the census. Mary, who had no intention of going to Bethlehem when the angel had visited her nine months earlier, finds herself in her final month of pregnancy as they begin the trip. As the couple arrives in Bethlehem, Mary gives birth to the Christ Child, fulfilling the prophecy of Micah 5:2. Caesar had no clue when he enacted the decree to take a census that he was a pawn in the Hand of a sovereign Lord who was arranging and moving events in place to fulfill His Word. Events that appeared unrelated to man were ordained by the One who sits on the throne of the universe, directing events to bring about the realization of His promise.

Isn't that the essence of the story of Christmas? God has not forgotten us. As Emmanuel, He is with us. His presence is always among us. Christmas reminds us that the Hand of God is always working behind the scenes, arranging events and circumstances to fulfill His will in our lives and in world affairs. As Christians, our lives are not a series of "accidents" and coincidences, but our Sovereign Lord is always working on our behalf, even when we can't see it and we don't understand.


The message of Christmas is that we are never alone, our Lord is present with us and walks with us daily. The message of Christmas is that our Lord is never inactive in our lives! The message of Christmas is that the Lord births hope in our midst, even in our darkest hour. In the nights of our life, the glory of the Lord shines round about us, assuring us that a Savior has penetrated the darkness of our every night with His glorious Light.

Our response to the Sovereign of the universe should be the same as the humble shepherds, bowing before Him in worship and adoration. Even though the shepherds had plenty of questions swirling in their hearts as they made their way from the manger back to their flocks, they knew in their hearts the God of eternity had invaded time and He had invaded their lives. Christmas reminds us once again, our transcendent God clothed Himself in our flesh to walk among us.

As we come before Him in worship, we arise to never be the same again. The God who spoke the worlds into existence has indeed invaded time and is in the midst of every circumstance we experience and every pain we endure. Christmas is about a promise kept by holy God and the promise that He will never leave nor forsake us. O, what a Savior.




