## *From Your Director of Missions:*

Well, March has arrived, signaling spring is soon to officially replace the barrenness of winter. March, always reminds me of participation in spring sports in our schools. When I was in high school and college many moons ago, March meant the beginning of outdoor track practice and races. As one who ran competitive track in high school and college, I loved running relay races. A relay race consisted of four runners who would run a prescribed distance with each having to successfully pass a baton to their teammate until the last runner crossed the finish line.

Each runner realized if the baton was dropped the race was over, so each runner held on to the baton tightly until it was passed to the next anxiously waiting relayist. The worst sound a relay team can hear is their metal baton clanging on the track. When that happens, the race is suddenly and sadly over. While the race is underway every relay participant views the baton as more valuable than gold.

In a very real sense, we as Christians are in a relay race. We possess that which is much more valuable than a relay baton. We possess the Gospel of Jesus Christ; we possess the Good News. The author of Hebrews tells us to run the race with perseverance and persistence (Hebrews 12:1-2). Since the time of Christ, there have been innumerable Christians who have faithfully carried the Gospel baton. Upon the completion of their race, they passed the baton off to the next generation who in turn have done the same at the completion of their race. Some one passed it off to us.

Since 1903 the members of the Surry Baptist Association has faithfully sought to unite as local churches in the shard spreading of the Gospel. We are living in perilous times, and we cannot slacken our pace in the race of faith, nor can we drop the baton. We must do as Paul said, "Keep pressing toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:14). Paul is using picturesque language to describe a runner, straining and giving their all as they run toward the finish line. For Paul there is no giving up or slowing the pace. We must heed his advice. Each of us, as individuals and as churches, must pray for the Lord to infuse us with strength to not slacken our pace in the spread of the Gospel. Just as the track coach is counting on his four relay runners to finish the race well, our Heavenly Coach, Jesus Christ, is counting on you and me to be faithful unto the end.

When I ran a relay race, I always seemed to run harder because I was running for more than myself but my teammates. I was running for a greater cause and purpose. Well, I can think of no greater cause or purpose than the spread of the Gospel and

giving our best for our Savior. We must press onward.

As I write this, I am entering my tenth year as your Director of Missions. (Where has the time gone.) It is truly a privilege and an honor. I don't want to drop the baton, but to continue pressing onward for Christ. Let us serve faithfully our Savior together, until he tells us to pass the baton to another. Paul said, "Let a man be found faithful." May that be our motto as Surry Baptists. And if I can ever be of help to you in any way, give me a call or stop by the office.






